Sheri outlined the history of proposed development of property in the vicinity which is owned by Victoria Village. A proposal to build a 12 storey building at Wellington and Toronto Streets was delayed by a city bylaw which limited building height to 5 storeys. Sheri advised that VV opposed that bylaw at an OMB hearing and won that case so the building will proceed. It will house both independent living and assisted living units. The construction is still "in process" so watch for more on this in the future.</p>

<b>a) Resident Survey Concerns</b>	<p>Lorraine expressed the opinion that the resident Long Term Care Survey at 67 questions is too long. She also questioned the wording contained in some areas of the document. Olivia advised that while she didn't necessarily disagree, the survey questions are set and the same for all provincial LTC facilities. This allows individual facilities to see where they stand with others in the province. Olivia advised that they also use question responses to plan things like training for staff and/or residents. Also discussed was whether a "No" response was a negative or just a fact as some residents have to deal with challenges such as dementia.
